High fashion at home

What do New York, Milan and now Rosetown, Saskatchewan have in common?

All of their residents have access to some of the biggest labels in the fashion industry.

A new boutique, 'Urban Flair', has opened its doors in Rosetown and owner-operator Sherry Hill says customers have been pleased with the new contemporary look.

On the shelves are clothing by Esprit, Tommy Hilfiger, Mexxs, InWear and Baby Phatt.

Baby Phatt?

According to Hill, "It's all the rage. The clothing and accessories are all very contemporary and offer a more cosmopolitan look and feel."

Hill took over ownership of the former W. J. Scott and Son Jewelers building in January.

"My intention was to have a New York theme on a small scale but still keep the integrity of the heritage the building came with," said Hill.

"Because of the years of service the Scott family gave to the surrounding community, the store already had developed its own traffic. I felt it was very important and because I already have a store (Flair Fashions) on Main Street I felt it was also important that Main Street businesses remain full."

The 88-year-old W. J. Scott and Son Jewelers business was owned and operated by three generations of the Scott family of Rosetown.

W. J. Scott purchased Lampman Jewelers in Rosetown in 1917 but didn't move to Rosetown until 1918. He built at the current location of the Main Street store in 1926. Bill Scott (W. J. Scott's son) went into business with his father after returning from serving in World War II. Bill



retired from the store in 1987 and Reinie and Barbara (Bill's daughter) Janke took over and owned the store until selling it to Hill in January.

"Everyone is glad we kept the integrity of the antique cabinetry. It means a lot to them to be able to see it when they come through the doors because to them it was an important feature of the store," said Hill.

"Response has been great - phenomenal. The traffic already into the store has been beyond my expectations as yesterday (Wednesday) most of the customers were from out of town which is excellent not only for my store but for all the other businesses in Rosetown as well."

New business: 180 new jobs for southwest

Modus Structures Inc., a manufacturing company, has purchased the former National Manufacturing building in Swift Current, and plans to employ 180 people there by 2010.

Modus, which manufactures modular buildings, windows and doors, and engineered panel systems, is based in Crossfield, Alberta. Swift Current City council approved tax concessions for Modus at its April 10 meeting - the company plans to occupy and start operations in the building by September.

John Verhagen, President and CEO of Modus, said expanding operations into Swift Current has a number of benefits for the company. Modus currently has three plants in Crossfield - a community of 2,700 north of Calgary - but by starting a new plant in Swift Current rather than Alberta, Verhagen believes the company saved money on the building purchase and has better access to workers.

"We thought it was a good location simply because it's on the number one and number four highways," said Verhagen, from his Crossfield office. "We feel Saskatchewan has great growth potential in the near future. A lot of our products can be shipped long distances anyway, so location wasn't always a big hindrance."

Modus will have to install large doors into the 100,000 square foot building, but not many other renovations will be needed. By September, the company plans to have 30 employees in Swift Current, and will add equipment and workers on a regular basis until March 2010, when it plans to employ 180 people. When fully operational, Modus expects yearly

gross sales from Swift Current to reach \$40 million. Verhagen said the City of Swift Current has been helpful during the sale process.

"The City treated us very well," he said. "I was quite impressed with the progressive attitude of the town." Vim Parmar, President of the Swift Current Chamber of Commerce, said there is work to do to accommodate new workers that will come to the community as a result of the new business. Though there will be challenges, the continued growth of business in the city is positive, he said.

"With the Chamber we have our [Labour Attraction and Retention Committee] trying to address labour shortages, and a housing committee on there as well, so we're looking at both these issues and trying to get the community engaged," he said.

**Modus Structures Inc.,

in Swift Current by 2010.**

Under the City's new business tax incentive policy, Modus receives a 100 per cent exemption in their first year of operation, a 50 per cent exemption in the second year, and a 25 per cent exemption in year three.

Councillor Jerrod Schafer said the incentive policy shows outside companies that Swift Current is open for business. "It's certainly an incentive to say on our behalf - we want you to locate to Swift Current and be part of our community, because it does provide that incentive that they will be a perpetual taxpayer once they're here," he said.
